A couple adopted a 12 year old girl, which I suspect is no easy thing when children are that age. Legally she was theirs but it took years for her to get over the foster homes she had been in, the neglect she had experienced as well as the distrust & fear which had been internalized. She was a broken young girl and you can imagine how much love & commitment her new parents needed to give her.

Love had to be gentle but firm .. demanding yet forgiving, and over a lot of time it bore fruit. By the end of her High School years she felt <u>at home</u> & slowly she realised she was saying <u>Dad & Mum</u> to those who had adopted her. But it was at her wedding that people cried as she paid tribute to her parents who, despite her rebelliousness, hostility and unlovable ways; despite everything she had done to try and break up the family relationship, she had been **Loved Into that Family.**

AN UNUSUAL WAY TO REMEMBER JESUS



For centuries, Christians have developed many and varied traditions to help recall the life of Jesus. Joyce and Nev Killip showed me something in the Church office this week, they came upon this rather unusual way of remembering the events of Good Friday. It involves this strange article in the photo, it is the underside of a Catfish skull! Sometimes the catfish is referred to as the crucifix fish.

Joyce picked up this piece in WA around Lake Argyle near Port Headland.

Can you see a figure with outstretched arms as if on a cross? The agony in that face?

Can you see behind, a fearful Devil-like character as if being carried on their back? The photo is actually on the underside of the skull. The bones seem to be shaped as a crucifix. Does this remind us of Jesus on His Cross?

Other symbolic features were also found in this unexpected icon. The Sanctuary (or the Church) lays below the feet of Jesus! The skull will make a rattling sound when shaken. The sound comes from otoliths, or ear stones, which provide fish with balance.

One legend states the sound represents the breaking of the tip of the lance used to pierce Jesus's side when he was crucified. And, another states it's the sound of dice being rolled as Roman soldiers gambled for Jesus' clothing.

It may seem at first a strange way to become focused on Jesus ... however God has a way of using strange and unexpected things to draw us back to him. Even in a throw away catfish skull, God hides a reminder of Jesus! Cheers Jimmy Adapted from NEWS & VIEWS 20 April 1997
