Collect: Great God of glory, we thank you for your Word. May it shine as brightly in our hearts as your glory was reflected off the countenance of Moses, that all in darkness might come to know you, Amen.

From the desk of the minister:

Where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is Freedom

This is part of the reading from the Epistle of St. Paul this week. Paul is using the veil in the story of Moses in Exodus 34 to highlight people who are lacking in faith. Paul is looking from a Christian perspective. He believes the old covenant has faded in the light of God's plan revealed in Jesus. If we don't put our trust in Christ, that same veil is still there. Christ has removed the veil enabling everyone to come in relationship and worship God. When the Spirit comes to live in us, we gain a new understanding of our relationship with God.

The real freedom comes from the Spirit of Christ

St. Paul was not a perfect man at the beginning. He persecuted the church and on his way at the Damascus Rd, he was changed by God, his life was transformed to be the best-chosen cup of Christ to tell his Good News. The new light of Christ has come to set us free from all our weaknesses.

As we are moving closer into the Lent Season, we are reminded the importance of our journey of faith. When Christ set his face to go to Jerusalem in Luke 9:51, it means, Jesus has crossed the point of no return. He is going out in obedience to complete his call from God. Our call is to journey with Christ, on this journey letting go of all the burdens that have weighed us down and to focus on Jesus because the veil has been taken from our eyes. Yes, the best preparation for our Lenten journey is to repent and be transformed in his glory to do his mission in the world.

TODAY'S VANDERBILT LECTIONARY

Transfiguration Sunday 27 February 2022

Exodus 34:29-35, 2 Corinthians 3:12 to 4:2, Luke 9:28-43a, Psalm 99.

The Transfiguration was a special event in which God allowed certain apostles to have a privileged spiritual experience that was meant to strengthen their faith for the challenges they would later endure. However, it was only a temporary event. It was not meant to be permanent. In the same way, at certain times in this life, God may give certain members of the faithful (not all of the faithful, all the time), special experiences of his grace that will strengthen their faith. We should welcome these experiences for the graces that they are, but we should not expect them to continue indefinitely, nor should we be afraid or resentful when they may cease. They may have been meant only as momentary glimpses of the joy of heaven to sustain us as we face the challenges of this life, to help strengthen us on the road that will ultimately bring us into the infinite and endless joy of heaven.
