Collect: Gentle shepherd, unseen but always present, we gather together and confess our need for your guidance. Lead us in our worship today, and then lead us beyond our worship into service in your name for your world. Your goodness and mercy uphold us. Your care for us astounds us. Your faithfulness in the natural world and in our lives sustains us. We praise you. We worship you, Amen.

From the desk of the minister: Psalm 23 – The Nightingale of the psalms Psalm 23 is probably the best-known psalm in the whole collections. No wonder Henry Ward Beecher called it 'the nightingale of the psalms'. We tend to hear this in a funeral service or a wedding celebration, but to restrict its use to these occasions would be wrong. It is a psalm for the whole life. My first experience with sheep was in Narrandera years ago. We went with the farmer in his utility to have a look at the flock. We approached a flock of about twenty and there is very narrow space not far from where they stood. Jim the farmer, said to me. "If one sheep started to run to that narrow space, the whole lot will follow". To my amazement, one started to run and the rest took off too. If there was deep cliff there, they would all have fallen down into the cliff. Sheep tend to wander off the right path if left to their own devices. David recognizes that we all tend to be a bit like sheep in this respect. That is why we need God's help to point us in the right direction. The shepherd is never more needed than in times of danger. Sometimes the flock had to travel through deep rough places where there was little light. In those shadowy places the sheep had to rely on their shepherd to take care of them. Like David, he faced the wild animals when they tried to snatch one of the flock. For us believers, there are periods in our lives when we have to walk through very dark times, but when we put our trust in the Lord, we feel the comfort and the peace in our heart because his promise is always with us. "Even though I walk through the darkest valley, I will fear no evil, for you are with me; your rod and your staff, they comfort me." The psalm ends with a bold statement of faith. David has confidence that God will be with him throughout his time on earth. At the conclusion of his earthy life there will be a place for him in God's house for ever. We all looking forward to the house that our Lord is making for all his children. Grace & Peace, Rev Maile
