# Rev Maile Molitika - Minister's Message The Spirit of Pentecost moves Dr. James Egan Moulton to Tonga

A few days ago, we experienced the ascension of Jesus while his disciples were witnessing his amazing departure. According to Acts 1:8, Jesus promises to his disciples; "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth."

We experience that promise on Pentecost Sunday. They were all together in one place. And suddenly there came from heaven the Holy Spirit, and they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit gave them utterance. This is one of the great stories in our history, about the guidance of God through the Holy Spirit, enabling a great missionary to go to Tonga. Dr James Egan Moulton travelled from England and his first priority was to go to China, but at that time King Thakompau of Fiji required a missionary for his group of islands to which the gospel dawn had just begun to break. So, Dr Moulton started to learn Fijian, and had prepared a written sermon in the Fijian tongue.

Upon his arrival in Australia, he had all the qualifications to start this new institution of Newington College in 1863 and was the first Principal of Newington College. He got married in December 23, 1863 in Melbourne. They returned to Sydney to await their calling to Fiji. Then a letter reached the President begging the conference to send Dr. Moulton to Tonga for the purpose of setting up an educational establishment there, the letter was signed by King George Tupou of Tonga. It was unanimously decided to accept that request from Tonga. Dr. Moulton went to Tonga in May 1865 and started Tupou College on the 14th February 1866.

Rev Siupeli Taliai, past principal of Tupou College quoted this: "There can be no doubt, however, that Dr Moulton was a great servant of his Lord, a rare faithful and gifted missionary par-excellence, a remarkable man with strong and distinctive educational views.

He could have qualified as a genius, with vast and varied powers, all under the control of one who set his face like a flint as he strove to do the will of Him Who sent him to this little Kingdom in the Pacific."

So, why did he end up in Tonga? The Spirit of God led him there!

With jumbo jets landing every few minutes, disgorging passengers returning from overseas, Sydney's International Air Terminal on a Saturday morning is a seething mass of people. We had gone to Mascot to meet my sister-in-law, who was returning from missionary service in Indonesia. With such a crowd, we had no idea how we would find her, as she wasn't expecting us to be waiting for her and would not be looking out for us.

What a shemozzle! There were so many exits from customs that we were quite perplexed as to where we should wait. Eventually we stationed ourselves strategically, one at each end of the reception area, hoping to "head her off" whichever way she should come. I was most fortunate, and found a relatively clear space as my lookout. My wife, however, found herself in the middle of an excited crowd, apparently a family of Greeks, out in full strength to meet a relative returning on the same flight. Aunts and Uncles, brothers and sisters, and children were all there. The only problem was that my wife (who could be easily mistaken for a Greek!) was caught up in the middle of them! So, when their Greek relatives appeared through the doorway, the crowd around my wife surged forward in a wild frenzy of hugs and embraces, welcoming the newcomers. I am not at all sure that she missed out on it either! This unknown Greek family are still trying to work out who the stranger was in their midst!

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From our point of view the whole incident was quite amusing. In fact, we found ourselves sharing something of the joy and excitement of that family's reunion. Such enthusiasm is quite contagious. But there were deeper elements to the whole thing. For a few brief moments, we experienced something of being part of a world family. We were all in it together as just one family.

I am reminded of the injunction which God gave the Hebrew people to welcome those who were "strangers" among them. God was seeking to teach his people to recognise that all are part of the human family, as all were created "in the image of God" (Genesis 1:27).

The inclusiveness of God's family reached fuller expression in the Christian church where once again the people were instructed that they were "no longer strangers, but fellow citizens, members of the household of God" (Ephesians 2:19). Indeed, Christ came to break down social and racial barriers, enabling all to experience what it means to be "one family" under God.

It is a tragedy of the modern era that we do not recognise others as fellow travellers, human creations of the same Creator. Recognition of the "other", not as a stranger, but as a fellow citizen, brings a sense of joyous excitement to the human experience.

In Christ there is no East or West, In Him no South or North, But one great fellowship of love, Throughout the whole wide earth.

Their high communion find.
