Pentecost 14

Collect: Bright and shiny are the coins when we find them, no matter how dull and scraped when we lost them. Lord, you make all things new, especially our lives. Renew us, revive us, restore us. Find us. Rejoice with me, God's people. The lost has been found! Amen. From the desk of the minister: The Lost has been found!

When the shepherd was looking for the lost sheep, he was thoroughly seeking every avenue that the sheep might have turned astray from the flock. In verse 5 – "When he has found it, he lays on his shoulders and rejoices." He does not drive the poor sheep home. This is not the way of the gentle Eastern shepherd. He bends down and lifts it up, and lays it on his shoulders and carries it back. There is a wonderful revelation in his gentle touch in this depiction. Let us be sure that we understand just what the words say - we all know that Christ carried our sin when he went to the cross. We know, too that we may cast our burdens upon him. But here we learn that Christ wants to carry, not only our sins, not just our burdens and cares, but ourselves. The shepherd took up the sheep itself and laid it upon his shoulders. He does it with 'rejoicing'. Can this be true? Does Christ really have enough interest in any human being on this earth to be made sad by his wandering, and glad by his recovery? That moment overwhelms! We can understand a shepherd's rejoicing when he bears a sheep that has been lost and we can definitely understand a mother's joy when her lost son is brought back to her door. On the other hand, the heart of Jesus rejoiced when he found us, and bore us back toward home, seems too amazing to be true. Yet here, the epistle of 1 Timothy 1 today also reminded us in v.15 - Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners. We may wander off in our journey and end up in the wrong place, but repentance is always the way back to God's favour. Grace & Peace, Rev Maile
