# Graham's Reflection

## February 2023





Greetings Mary Burnett Presbytery, and God's richest blessings to you all.

I trust and pray that the joy and excitement of the Advent/ Christmas season still lingers and is providing a good springboard for leaping into a year full of potential for all who put their faith in Christ.

As the year commences, I am drawn to two words: Vision and Mission. Vision and Mission are words that are spoken about SO much at church that to be honest, we can get sick of hearing them. Are they really that im-

portant? The simple answer is 'yes'! Because our identity as a church, and our purpose as Christ's disciples are inherently and unavoidably based on our perception of Mission and Vision. Jesus sends us into the world to 'Preach the Gospel' and 'Make Disciples'. The Basis of Union (BOU) repeatedly reminds us that we are called to be instruments of Christ's mission of reconciliation. For example, Paragraph 3 states that the Church's call is, "to be a fellowship of reconciliation, a body within which the diverse gifts of its members are used for the building up of the whole, an instrument through which Christ may work and bear witness to himself".

But this is a huge call and seems daunting if we only consider it in general terms. Whereas, having a vision and understanding of our own particular purposes and missional needs help us to focus on the priorities we must adopt to best fulfil God's will for our congregations and across the Presbytery. We need a vision or plan of what we would like the church to look like in the future. We need a goal to prevent us from stagnating or falling into a maintenance or survival mode. (cont. next page)

# **2023 NAIDOC Local Grants**

This grant opportunity provides funding to organisations to contribute to the cost of activities held during NAIDOC Week 2023 (2 - 9 July) that celebrate First Nations' histories, cultures, achievements and continuing contributions to our country and society. ## Green care and community garden projects

The Community Sustainability Action grants provide grant funding to eligible community groups and individuals for innovative projects which seek to address climate change, conserve Queensland's natural and built environment and protect our unique wildlife. <u>Click here</u> for more information.

## **Gambling Community Benefit Fund**

Round 115 is now closed. Round 116 (\$100k super round) will open mid-January 2023 and close at midnight on 28 February 2023.

The Gambling Community Benefit Fund (GCBF) is Queensland's most extensive one-off community grant program and distributes approximately \$60 million annually to not-for-profit community groups. The GCBF funding helps these groups to provide services, leisure activities and opportunities for Queensland communities. In 2023, the GCBF program has four funding rounds available:

1. \$100,000 super round for all priorities—closes 28 February

- 2. \$35,000 standard grant round—closes 31 May
- 3. \$35,000 standard grant round—closes 31 August
- 4. \$35,000 standard grant round—closes 31 October.

To check eligibility requirements and understand your organisation's responsibilities throughout all stages of the grant funding process, read the guidelines for GCBF applicants and instructions for applying for and using the GCBF grant.
