Tears in the midst of cheers!

Next week, Palm Sunday is being celebrated. This is a celebratory day in the church calendar. It is also referred to by many as Passion Sunday.

Something happened on that first Palm Sunday which may have overlooked. It is a strange thing perhaps, but few have noticed it.

As Jesus and his entourage of disciples and enthusiastic supports were making their way into Jerusalem for the commencement of Passover, the crowd was building as they got closer to the city gates. The crowd began singing Psalms, chanting "Hosanna", and waving palm branches.

But as the chants rose, one person was not celebrating, not rejoicing, not smiling – he was crying. Luke's Gospel tells us that while the crowd was cheering, Jesus was weeping. **Tears in the midst of cheers!**

This is very significant for rarely do we encounter Jesus crying, overwhelmed with grief. But why this time? We know why – there's no need to speculate. As the tears streamed down his face, with Jerusalem immediately ahead of him,

he cried aloud, "If only you knew, on this day of all days, the things that make for peace." Luke 19:42

Through the week ahead, on each day Jesus contends for peace, contends for peace of humanity, and for our peace. "If only you knew", he says.

As we prepare for and celebrate Easter this year, there are many who are also weeping. The horror of war in Palestine, appears as an eternal war for which the roots and immediate causes are known, but for which there seems to be no plausible answer.

How do you define peace?
What are the critical steps needed to recreate peace in the midst of terrible conflict?

Relevant to this 21st century conflict is the example of the **Book of Jonah**. Jonah was very reluctant to be an actor in the midst of imminent violence, but when turned around by God, he went to Nineveh (a world power of the time) and called all who were committed to violence to repent from their commitment to violence - no matter who they were (the King, all the way down to the boys in the streets, and then some..).

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And that call is a responsibility of the church today. Parallel to this is the prophetic role of **Amos**, who showed Israel that the way to turn around the obscene violence of their neighbouring states, was to repent of their hatred of their neighbours. The Torah (the Jewish

Law) commanded that they must love their neighbours. Is there clear teaching in our Christian Scriptures that demonstrate how to achieve peace?

During the week leading to the crucifixion of Jesus, Jesus wages peace, each day.

A parable (Luke 10:30-35) that is a summary of the Christian gospel, teaches that our church is to be an agent of healing and hospitality, no matter what the cost, even though we may have been wounded or oppressed. **Jesus is the model**;

Jesus is our commander; Jesus is our hope.

As the writings of Luke-Acts in the New Testament require us to be evidence of God's love breaking into the world, how can we as a church (Body of Christ) be obedient to Jesus Christ?


