From the desk of the minister:

Be kind to one another because life is too short

The story from the OT today is the story of David and Absalom. The rebellious son was against his Father's army, but the command from King David to his commanders was clear – "Be gentle with the young man Absalom for my sake." Absalom was riding his mule under the oak tree and his hair got caught in the branches. He was left hanging in the air and he was killed by the soldiers. When the news reached out to the king, he was heart- broken. He went to his room and wept. "O my son Absalom! My son, my son Absalom!

If only I had died instead of you – O Absalom, my son, my son!"

In spite of all their differences, David was still the boy's father,
and his heart was broken.

The tragedy of the story of David and Absalom is that death arrived before reconciliation did. It is a haunting reminder that no matter how badly relationships may be broken; there is always the potential for grace to prevail while the parties remain alive. Once death comes, there is then no chance for reconciliation. I always remind my congregation wherever I go about the importance of living life according to God's way and direction.

If there is a need for reconciliation in a broken relationship – DO NOT DELAY, DO IT STRAIGHTAWAY!

I have seen so many situations where the family feud went too far and there was no chance of reconciliation at all. The forgiveness that could have been offered was withheld and would nevermore be present in the relationship.

David's heart was broken because what 'could have been' and 'should have been'

would never be between himself – the king – and his rebellious son.

His cry is the cry of a devastated, heartbroken father who had lost the opportunity to make things right between himself and his son. It was too late for David.

I do hope it won't be too late for all of us.
