Word: Mark 12.38-44 Warning Against the Teachers of the Law

³⁸ As he taught, Jesus said, "Watch out for the teachers of the law. They like to walk around in flowing robes and be greeted with respect in the marketplaces, ³⁹ and have the most important seats in the synagogues and the places of honour at banquets. ⁴⁰ They devour widows' houses and for a show make lengthy prayers. These men will be punished most severely."

The Widow's Offering

- ⁴¹ Jesus sat down opposite the place where the offerings were put and watched the crowd putting their money into the temple treasury. Many rich people threw in large amounts.

 ⁴² But a poor widow came and put in two very small copper coins, worth only a few cents.
- ⁴³ Calling his disciples to him, Jesus said, "Truly I tell you, this poor widow has put more into the treasury than all the others. ⁴⁴ They all gave out of their wealth; but she, out of her poverty, put in everything—all she had to live on."

COMMENTARY How do we judge someone's intentions?

How do you know a long prayer is for appearance rather than genuine virtue?

While these questions are not easy to answer, what seems clear is Mark's intention to reevaluate the importance of giving everything.

In the Kingdom of God, what is valued and important is different from that of our human kingdom.

Q 2 Money is a very controversial topic.

Why do you think Jesus spoke about it so often?

- Q 3 We live in a world that always has money for war but never enough for poverty and homelessness. Please discuss
- Q 4 We should always be generous givers, but it could be our time, talents or money. Do you agree with this?
- Q 5 Jesus warned about trying to make a good impression and had no time for the Pharisee hypocrites who had no love for God.
