#### From the desk of the minister: The Resurrection of Jesus



The resurrection story from John's gospel began with Mary Magdalene who went early to the tomb and found that the stone had been rolled away from the entrance. She ran to Peter and John and told them the story. Immediately, the two disciples ran to the tomb. John outran Peter and reached the tomb first, but did not get in. When Peter arrived, he entered and noticed the linen wrappings lying there, while the cloth that had covered Jesus' head was folded up and lying apart from the other wrappings. John, who reached the tomb first, went in, saw, and believed. At the height of their grief and confusion, they learned that the body of Jesus was no longer in the tomb. Mary had first suspected that the body was stolen, but as for Peter and John, the teachings of Jesus finally made sense. One had already saw and believed. They realized that Jesus had told them all along that he would rise from the dead after three days. The journey through Holy Week becomes a metaphor for humanity's whole journey through life. It is about discipleship that is found wanting, about separation from God and the need for healing and forgiveness. But ultimately it is about life, life out of death. The challenge of Easter is for us to be transformed into new life or we may stay stagnant because, many think, it's only an event to be remembered but does not impact our inner

being. Let us not be just onlookers to the resurrection, but people who

experience its real power for salvation. Grace and peace. Maile.
