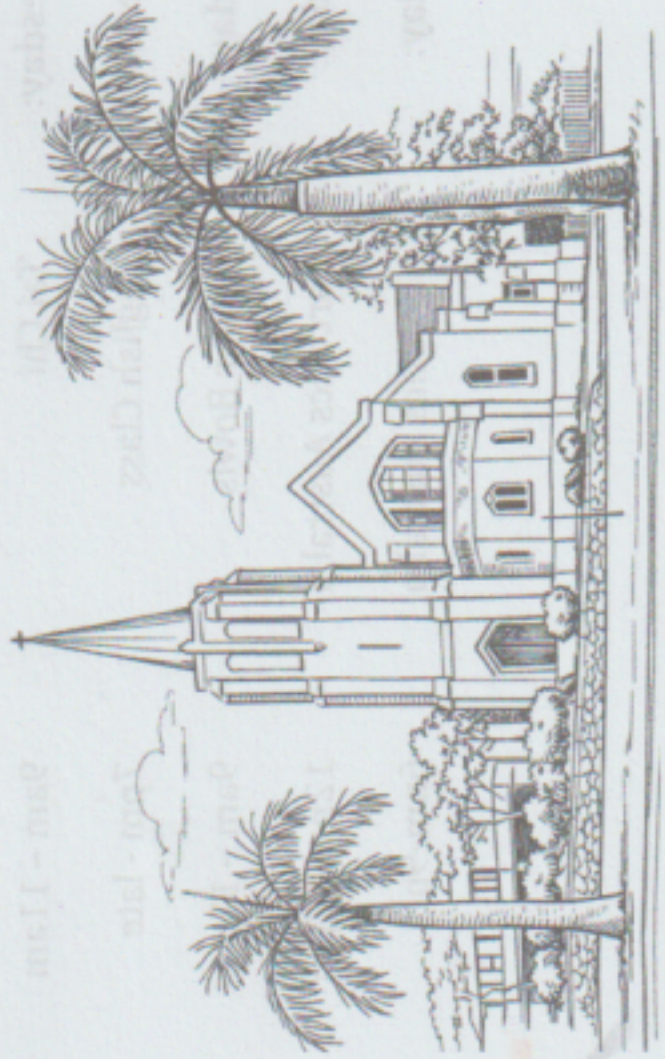

From the Desk of the Minister

Collect: O God, whose glory it is always to have mercy: Be gracious to all who have gone astray from your ways, and bring them again with penitent hearts and steadfast faith to embrace and hold fast the unchangeable truth of your Word. Jesus Christ your Son; who with you and the Holy Spirit lives and reigns, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

From the desk of the minister:

We must be born again

The story from the Gospel today is a well-known story. Nicodemus was a great Pharisee, an expert of the law and a member of the Sanhedrim. He came to Jesus by night trying to seek the truth that Jesus is telling his audience.

Nicodemus started with this question – "Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher who has come from God, for no one can do these signs that you do apart from the presence of God." Jesus answered, "I tell you the truth, unless a man is born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God." Nicodemus misunderstands Jesus, he was thinking of the earthly birth which is impossible. But Jesus is talking about supernatural birth, birth that comes from the heavenly Father. Nicodemus is stuck. He comprehends only one kind of birth. He understands only the earthly, the possible, the temporal, while Jesus is speaking of the heavenly, the actual, the eternal. Jesus' statement is clear and simple. To enter into the kingdom of God requires a radical reorientation of life in which we are born from above. But this shatters Nicodemus' feeling of sufficiency. He thinks that he is able on his own to make it to God.

We are reminded that we cannot make it to eternal life by our own. We need the help of Jesus to enter the kingdom of heaven. Born again or born of the spirit is the way to go. As we continue our journey in Lent, we are reminded of this man who thought that life eternal can be achieved by his own merits. Life is given to us through faith in Jesus, "For God did not send his Son into the world to be its judge, but to be its saviour."
